

# What is **ASEAN**?

The Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) has taken significant steps to create a single economic market for goods, services, capital and labour in the region. ASEAN is working towards creating a unified regional patent procedural system, like the European Patent Convention. As a first step, the ASEAN Patent Examination Cooperation Program (ASPEC) has been implemented to expedite prosecution of patent applications in ASEAN countries once allowance of a related application in an ASEAN country has been achieved.

# Why file in ASEAN countries

The ASEAN market is a huge growth area and represents the the world's third largest market after China and India.

# STRONG ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

- In 2020 ASEAN registered growth of US\$70 billion in greenfield investments. It was the biggest such FDI inflow of any developing world region.
- In 2016 the region's annual average GDP growth was 4.6 per cent outpacing the global average of 3.2 per cent.\*
- The ASEAN combined GDP (as a single economic entity) is currently around US\$2.5 trillion and taken as a whole the region is set to become the equivalent of the world's fourth largest economy by 2030.\*
- As evidenced by the surge in locally originating patent fillings large multinational firms are looking to take advantage of the favourable economic conditions for manufacturing and R&D in ASEAN countries.


# ESTABLISHED PATENT SYSTEMS

- All ASEAN countries (except Myanmar) are members of the Patent Cooperation Treaty. Cambodia recently became a member of the PCT and has been bound by the PCT system since 8 December 2016. Myanmar provides IP protection.
- The ASEAN countries (except Myanmar) have well developed patent legislation.
- Strong development of IP examination procedures, specialised courts and enforcement procedures. This has led to a rapid increase in patent filings in the region.

### PPH & ASPEC

• Examination in the ASEAN countries can be relatively straight forward using Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH), ASEAN Patent Examination Co-operation (ASPEC) program or, if a corresponding application has been allowed in major jurisdiction such as the United States, Japan, Europe, or Australia.







Filed with English specification, followed by Indonesian specification due within 1 month from national filing date.

# 5. NATIONAL PHASE ENTRY IN INDONESIA

- Deadline = 31 months from the priority date
- Can be late-filed up to 43 months (i.e. 12 month extension) with payment of fine
- Required:
- Copy of the published international application
- Verified Indonesian translation of specification and any Art 19/34 amendments
- PCT/IB/306, PCT/RO/101, ISR and WO



- For Convention cases, certified copy of the Priority Document which is issued by the first receiving office is required
- The original document along with its English translation must be submitted within 60 days from the filing date
- Lao translation to be finished within 90 days from the date of filing


### 4. SPECIFICATION AND PRIORITY DOCUMENTS

- If the specification and/or the PCT Request Form is not in English or Bahasa Malaysia, then we need:
- Verified English translation of PCT Request Form and/or specification
- Verified English translation of any amendments filed
- For rushed filings, if a Verified English translation is not available:
- Although possible, but not recommended, can submit a machine-translated version and thereafter file the verified translation
- An unverified translation (with the verification to follow later), that would perhaps work better than a machine translated version

### 5. NATIONAL PHASE ENTRY IN MALAYSIA

- Deadline = 30 months from the priority date
- Extendible with evidence, at the discretion of the Registrar
- A Verified English translation of specification is required, PCT Request Form, and/or any Art 19/34 amendments, (if not in English or Bahasa Malaysia)





# No Patent System

It is currently not possible to file applications for patents in Myanmar.

The relevant legislation has been enacted. However, since early 2019 the patent law has been awaiting presidential notification before it can come into effect.





- Notarised and executed Power of Attorney (PoA) and a Thai translation thereof
- Original executed Statement of Applicant's Right to Apply for Patent (SOAR) and a Thai translation of the SOAR (only required if Applicant is inventor)
- Original executed Deed of Assignment (DoA) to be furnished within 90 days from the Thai filing date of the application
- Required for Convention cases where Applicant is not inventor
- Required for National Phase cases where there has been a change of Applicant

All forms due within 90 days from the filing date.

A general Power of Attorney is possible.

### 4. SPECIFICATION AND PRIORITY DOCUMENTS

- A Thai translation of the specification will need to be furnished within 90 days from the Thai filing date of the application
- For Convention cases, certified copy(ies) of the priority document will need to be furnished within 16 months from its first filing date but before the publication of the Thai application
- For National Phase cases, we will require a Verified English translation of specification, PCT Request Form and/or any Art 19/34 amendments, (if not in English or Bahasa Malaysia)

### 5. NATIONAL PHASE ENTRY IN THAILAND


- Deadline = 30 months from the priority date
- A request for restoration for Late Entering of National Phase may be filed within:
- 2 months from the ending date of the "event/cause" that prevented the national phase entry application from entering Thailand by the deadline; or
- 42 months from the first filing date




